






















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CRAFTER'S TOOL BELT



MATERIALS

Katia Big Alabama: 6 balls white col. 1, 2 balls pink col. 14, 1 ball yellow col. 20 and 1 ball lilac col. 24. Crochet hook: size G6 (U.S.)/(4 mm). Wool sewing needle.

For the backpack: 10" (25 cm) zip, 2 meter long strap, 2 grommets, large piece of cardboard.

For the belt: 1 meter long strap, 19 5/8" (50 cm) of elastic, buttons or snap fasteners.

For the cases: 2 small zips, 1 button.

ABBREVIATIONS

Ch st: Chain Stitch Ss: Slip Stitch Sc: Single Crochet

(...) mp: Work the instructions in between parentheses in the same stitch

[...]: Repeat the instructions in between square brackets the number of time indicated.

Inc: Increase Dec: Decrease

Rectangular base

Using Big Alabama in col. 1 (white), work 20 Ch sts, 1 Ch st to raise up the work. Work in circular around this strip of chain st.

R1. 19 Sc,(3 Sc) mp, 18 Sc, Inc **R2**. (1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 18 Sc, (1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 1 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 18 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 1 Sc

R3. 1 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 20

R9. 7 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 32 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 15 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 32 Sc,(1 Sc, 1 Ch st, 1 Sc) mp, 8 Sc, Ss Cut the yarn and put to one side.

Semicircular base

R1. Using Big Alabama in col. 1 (white), work a magic ring with 4 Sc. Turn the work at the end of the row.

R2. 1 Ch st, 4 Inc

R3. 1 Ch st, [1 Inc, 1 Sc] x 4

R4. 1 Ch st, [1 Inc, 2 Sc] x 4

R5. 1 Ch st, [1 Inc, 3 Sc] x 4

R6. 1 Ch st, [1 Inc, 4 Sc] x 4

R7. 1 Ch st, [1 Inc, 5 Sc] x 4

Circular Bag

R1. Using Big Alabama in col. 20 (yellow) work a magic ring with 6 Sc. Continue working in the round as follows:

R2. 6 Inc

R3. [1 Inc, 1 Sc] x 6

R4. [2 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6

R5. [1 Inc, 3 Sc] x 6

R6. [4 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6

R7. [1 Inc, 5 Sc] x 6

Triangular Pocket

Using Big Alabama in col. 14 (pink), work 9 Ch sts, 1 Ch st to raise up the work. Turn the work at the end of the row.

R1.1 Ch st, 1 Inc, 8 Sc

R2. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 8 Sc

R3. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 7 Sc

R4. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 6 Sc

R5. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 5 Sc

R6. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 4 Sc

R7. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 3 Sc

R8. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 2 Sc

R9. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec, 1 Sc

R10. 1 Ch st, 1 Dec

Work a border around the Sc and Inc at the corners.

Pentagonal Pocket

Using Big Alabama in col. 24 (lilac) work a magic ring with 5 Sc. Continue working in the round as follows:

R1. 5 Inc

R2. [1 Inc, 1 Sc] x 5

R3. [1 Inc, 2 Sc] x 5

R4. [(3 Sc) mp, 3 Sc] x 5

R5. 1 Sc, [(3 Sc) mp, 5 Sc] x 4,(3 Sc) mp, 4 Sc, 3 Ss


Making up


1. Sew the semi-circle to the lower left edge of the rectangle. Make a **border** around the base formed by the rectangle and the semi-circle: Sc, Inc at the corners and Ss at the right side.

2. Sew the belt strap to the back part of the base.

3. Sew the three coloured pockets as shown in the images. Leave the upper part of each pocket unsewn.

4. Lastly, sew on the elastic strips leaving three spaces to put the crochet hooks through.







KNITTING PROJECT BAG & YOGA MAT BAG



MATERIALS

Katia Big Alabama: 6 balls white col. 1, 2 balls pink col. 14, 1 ball yellow col. 20 and 1 ball lilac col. 24

Crochet hook: size G6 (U.S.)/(4 mm).

Wool sewing needle. For the backpack: 10" (25 cm) zip, 2 meter long strap, 2 grommets, large piece of cardboard.

For the belt: 1 meter long strap, 19 5/8" (50 cm) of elastic, buttons or snap fasteners. For the cases: 2 small zips, 1 button.

ABBREVIATIONS

Ch st: Chain Stitch Ss: Slip Stitch Sc: Single Crochet

(...) mp: Work the instructions in between parentheses in the same stitch

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Inc: Increase Dec: Decrease

Circular Base

R1. Using Big Alabama in col. 1 (white), work 6 Sc in a magic ring **R2**. 6 Inc (12 sts)

R3. [1 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (18 sts)

R4. [2 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (24 sts)

R5. [3 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (30 sts)

R6. [4 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (36 sts)

R7. [5 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (42 sts)

R8. [6 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (48 sts)

R9. [7 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6 (54 sts)

R10. [8 Sc, 1 Inc] x 6, Ss, 1 Ch st (60 sts)

R11 = Line 1 on the Graph. Work a cylinder in *tapestry* following the graph, which is read from right to left. Each square on the graph is one Sc. All the rows are worked in circular. Only the first line of the graph is worked in Sc in the back of the loops.

Flap

Repeat the instructions for **R1** to **R10** of the *Circular Base*.


R11. Work in Sc through the back of the loops. (60 sts)

R12. Work the whole row in Sc (60 sts)

Making up

- 1. Sew the flap onto the cylinder leaving a space for the 10" (25 cm) zip.
- 2. Sew on the strap and the handles.

Tip: To ensure that the backpack keeps its shape, use the cardboard on the inside. Remove the cardboard every time that the backpack is washed.



ACCESSORY CASES



insert and sew one of the small zips.

Triangular Case

Make 2 pieces following the instructions for the *Triangular Pocket*.

Making up: Sew these 2 pieces together at one side only and add a button & loop to fasten.

Pentagonal Case

Make 2 pieces following the instructions for the *Pentagonal Pocket*.

Making up: Sew these 2 pieces together leaving enough space to insert and sew one of the small zips.
